 - A wide range of budget situations were detailed, spanning "incredible growth" to "mixed news" to "grim."
 - Morale is low in a number of schools and colleges, in part due to budget conditions.

- The BPC acknowledged the service of Todd Haggerty as he departs for CU Boulder.
- Budget updates provided.
 - i. \$1.9 million shortfall coming into this year reflecting a decline of 2.6% rather than 1.3%
 - ii. Enrollment mix was beneficial
 - iii. Additional \$900,000 of shortfall resulting in total shortfall of \$2.8 million
 - iv. Structural budget deficit equals roughly 200 students (\$2.6 million)
 - v. Colorado moved to 49th lowest-funded state for higher education based on SHEEO data
 - vi. Need to reduce costs rather than deal with one-time funds each year
 - 1. Provost Nakuma will lead effort on the faculty side
 - 2. Sobanet and St Peter will lead effort on administration side
 - vii. No mid-year cuts anticipated, rather will adjust for next budget year
